

Style sheet for Journal of Gender Studies

1. REFERENCE

Authors should pay particular attention to the accuracy and correct presentation of references (see below). In-text references should be cited by giving the author's name, year of publication (Smith, 1999) and specific page numbers after a direct quotation. In-text lists of references should be in chronological order. A reference list should appear at the end of the article and should include only those references cited in the text. References should be double-spaced, arranged alphabetically by author, and chronologically for each author. Publications for the same author appearing in a single year should use e.g. 2001a, b, c, etc. Where there are more than two authors, the reference within the text should be cited as Smith et al. and the date, but include all the authors in the reference list.

Figures and Tables (see below) should have corresponding parenthetical “call-outs” at relevant places in the text that direct readers’ attention to the image or the table.


